Dear Mr Silverman, I write further to the Chief Executive's response to your email of 30th September 2013.

I have spoken to Colin Russell about this accumulation of bags and whilst there has no doubt been a problem in the past, and your webpage makes this clear, Colin assures me that his crews do proactively remove waste from this site, with or without works orders.

Colin will ensure that vigilance is maintained so that incidents do not recur. I share your view on trying to identify those involved with the illegal deposit of waste on the highway, even if it is "helpfully" piled up where it is obvious that the Council will remove it fairly quickly in the course of programmed bin emptying.

If there are further problems, I will ask the Anti Social Behaviour Investigations Team to look for any identifying correspondence or packaging that might lead to a perpetrator, but as resources are finite and there are many incidents of fly tipping across the borough, please note that this action will only be taken if Waste Services tell me that the fly tips are appearing again.
